



# YOUR VOTING OPTIONS UNDER THE CURRENT PHOTO VOTER ID LAW

If you have an accepted photo voter ID remember to bring it with you to the polls! **Even If you don't have an ID, you still have options to vote!**

**FORGOT TO BRING YOUR ID TO THE POLLS?**



You can cast a provisional ballot and return to your local County Board Of Elections (CBOE) to present an ID by November 14th, or use an ID Exception Form.

**CAN'T MAKE IT TO YOUR CBOE TO HAVE YOUR BALLOT COUNTED?**



If you have a hindrance from returning to the CBOE with your ID, you can request an ID Exception Form at the polls & still be allowed to vote with a provisional ballot.

**NOT SURE IF YOUR ID IS ACCEPTED?**

**HAVE LIMITATIONS THAT MAKE IT IMPOSSIBLE TO OBTAIN AN ID?**



If you have a hindrance from getting an ID such as lack of transportation, a disability, or lack of documents, you can request an ID Exception Form at the polls and vote with a provisional ballot.

**DRIVER'S  
LICENSE OR ID  
EXPIRED,  
SUSPENDED OR  
REVOKED?**



NCSBE requires IDs to be unexpired, or expired for one year or less.

A voter 65 or older may use an expired form of acceptable ID if the ID was unexpired on their 65th birthday.

A suspended or revoked license is not considered an accepted ID under this law.

You can vote with a Driver's license or non-driver ID from another state, District of Columbia, or U.S. territory **ONLY** if you registered in North Carolina within 90 days of the election
